Planting For the Future: Sowing Jewish Summer Camp and Reaping Vibrant Judaism

It's always a little strange that Tu B'Shevat, Judaism's celebration of trees, takes place in the dead of winter, as we marked it at the end of January. It doesn't feel like the time for planting or harvesting. Its timing, however, brings us hopeful, heartening visions of what is to come as Winter subsides – the return of bright greens, flowers, warmth, outdoor play and enjoyment of nature.

The timing may seem just as strange to talk summer plans in such proximity to snowstorms. But the Tu B'Shevat reminded us of two important things: 1) this is the time to envision what comes when winter is gone and 2) we have to sow the right seeds to yield the fruit we want. For millennia, Jews have yearned for – and figured out how to plant for - the

Jewish future of the next generation. The last several months, with rising antisemitism, the experiences of our college students and young adults, and questions about Zionism, Jewish history, Israel, and our values have reminded us to plant and tend what we hope will flourish.

What do I hope will flourish? Jewish knowledge, pride, community, spirit and connection probably top my list. That's why I take this moment, in the dead of winter, to talk summer. If you haven't thought about sending your kids or grandkids to Jewish summer camp, or haven't acted on it, now is the time! Talk to any kid who goes to one of the great Jewish sleepaway camps and hear them gush about their friends and memories. Sit by them at services and hear them chant along comfortably. Talk with them about traveling to be at their camp friends' b'nai mitzvah around the region and the country or about the high school Israel trip they can't wait for with their camp friends. Have these conversations and you'll know a bit of the exuberant Jewish spirit that is cultivated at our summer camps.

Whether it is one of our great Reform movement camps or so many others that serve as our Temple's summer campuses, it's time to reserve your spot if you haven't already. I am thrilled to help you learn more and connect you with families that can tell you more about their experiences. We will also connect you with funds to help make it possible. From our Temple, from the Jewish Federation, and from foundations all over North America who are investing in the magic that Jewish camp delivers. Let's grow a new generation of Jewish summer campers here at the Temple, and watch the flowering of friendship, fun, knowledge and proud Jewish life!





Building Relationship and Cultivating Joy

Building relationships and cultivating joyfulness is something that comes naturally to young children. They are endlessly curious and can find wonder and kinship in the most unusual places. When a young child is in an environment that encourages bonding with caregivers and peers, that natural ability is nurtured and grows. Over the past two months I have been observing the children in our program and have discovered the many ways in which they are builders of community and seekers of joy.

Opportunities for relationships abound in our preschool. Whether it is through daily interactions with teachers or each other, our infants are encouraged to discover, and explore freely. The toddlers form their first friendships, and the preschoolers navigate conflict and reconciliation with their peers. These are the cultivated and spontaneous moments in which the sparks of connection are formed.

Beyond finding meaningful connections with each other, the children in our program are being given opportunities daily to cultivate joy. Having space in which the children can freely explore provides each child with the chance to experience joy. Watching a child dig in dirt may not seem like a moment of joy, but seeing their face light up when they find a worm or when they make a hole that's "just right," it undeniably is.





Most of us may never remember the first friend we made in preschool or the first time we heard our favorite childhood story being read, but the imprints of those moments stay with us throughout our lives. It is the goal of our preschool to give the children in our care as many opportunities for those early experiences as we can so that our young learners continue to be builders of community and seekers of joy for the rest of their lives.

Social Action Spotlight

Each month the Social Action Committee will highlight an organization that receives funds through the Temple's Social Action Allocations. This issue's spotlight is Alive Hospice.

Alive Hospice was founded in 1975 by Dr. John Flexner and Dr. David Barton with Lynn Barton as a co-founder. Alive Hospice provides adult and pediatric hospice care, palliative care, financial support, community education, memorials, and a



Grief Center that helps families heal from loss. The Temple's SAC funding helps to support Camp Forget-Me-Not, Alive's overnight grief camp for any child (aged 8-17) who has experienced the death of someone significant. The camp combines traditional camp activities with therapeutic activities from Alive's licensed grief counselors to remember loved ones and to make connections with other young people who are also grieving. In 2024, 75 kids will attend the camp. No child is turned away because of an inability to pay for the camp. Temple members Denise Alper, David Barton, and Lynn Barton currently serve as board members, and Donna Eskind serves on the

Advisory Council. Please consider volunteering at Alive Hospice. Alive Hospice has a wide range of volunteer activities which can be found at alivehospice.org. Some of these opportunities include serving as Companions, helping with Tell Me Your Story, singing and/or playing instruments in the Bedside Music program, assisting with Pet Peace of Mind, creating craft projects such as making shawls, afghans, lap blankets, and memory items, and providing other types of assistance in other areas.
